INTRODUCTION

We believe that students develop skills as much as a consequence of 'how' they are taught and learn as 'what' they are taught or learn. As such, we recognise that approaches which develop the ability to learn through planning. implementing and reviewing, which make good use of formative and summative assessment, and which encourage students to work and learn together as well as independently can have a significant role in successful outcomes and positive progression. We also appreciate that digital approaches and resources including artificial intelligence will play an increasingly

significant role in delivering effective learning, teaching and assessment. Our strategy therefore emphasises the importance of all students developing a broad range of skills with the development of skills in aspects such as numeracy, literacy, digital, problem solving and interpersonal skills alongside as the development of specific vocational skills.

This Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy will encourage and support innovative and creative approaches to learning, teaching and assessment so that all students are enabled to achieve their potential.

Through this, we will provide learning which is inclusive, engaging, stimulating, meets national standards and is relevant to needs of the economy and society. This strategy has been developed to complement College curriculum guidelines and development plans. Together they provide a statement of both "how we teach" and "what we teach". They also sit alongside a range of quality enhancement and organisational development processes that support teachers, curriculum teams and support staff to respond to key College enhancement themes, including retention, achievement and employability.

04

Provide students with appropriate guidance and support, referring to specialists and careers advisors where appropriate.



Develop Wider and Transferrable Skills

Encourage the use of effective project-based and experiential learning activities which develop transferrable and meta skills.

Prioritise opportunities for students to build experience of work though realistic work environments, practices and placements.

Prioritisation of teaching staff development

Integrating Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy aims into our quality review and enhancement arrangements

Through these we will support lecturer-led professional development and facilitate vocational upskilling opportunities. College learning and study resources and facilities

We will ensure the work of support service in areas such as Student Support Services and Student Information Services provides optimum support to learning, teaching and assessment. For example, our Guidance and Learning Support services will integrate closely with the Class Tutor role so that each learner is supported to develop their individual learning skills. We will also protect and prioritise the provision of mental health and wellbeing services, supporting students to stay healthy and sustain their studies.

We will continue to improve our learning, teaching and assessment facilities such as classrooms, workshops, libraries and student study places. This will include physical and digital resources, improving both our teaching spaces, learning and teaching materials and equipment, along with ICT resources to support learning and teaching. In doing so, we will aim to provide teaching facilities and learning resources which support students to gain industry relevant skills for both current and future labour market needs.
